Mark E. His articles appear in the *American Communication Journal*; *The Review of Communication*; *The Electronic Journal of Communication/La Revue Electronique de Communication*; *The Journal of African American Studies*; *KB Journal*; *Kentucky Journal of Communication*; *North Dakota Journal of Speech and Theatre*; and *The Successful Professor*. He is the recipient of the Distinguished Service Award from the Kenneth Burke Society, 2008, primarily for the creation of *KB Journal*; as well as the former President of the Kenneth Burke Society, NCA Branch.
