Indeed, NCLB accountability seemed to increase achievement among higher-achieving students, if by a smaller amount than it did among their low-achieving peers. For example, in 4th-grade math, we find that NCLB increased scores at the 10th percentile by roughly 0.29 standard deviations compared with an increase of only 0.17 standard deviations at the 90th percentile (see Figure 3). An effective redesign of accountability policies like NCLB may need to pay more specific attention to the processes and practices operating within schools. successful school reform Holding NCLB Accountable covers four themes.
