The title of this book may be a little deceptive because much of what is covered by Father Kenny will be very familiar to the new Catholic. For example, a good bit of the RCIA process is discussed and since the new convert will have just passed through this process the explanation offered here would be somewhat repetitive. Occasionally Father Kenny fails to mention that some Catholic practices that are no longer required by the Church are still practiced by many of the faithful and assumes that all Catholics have conformed to the more lax standards which is not always the case.
